

# Wainstone's Cup



Middlesbrough was the next stop on Friary's contest tour around the country to take part in the recently formed Wainstone's Cup, organised by the Dr. Martin Trust. Dr Ian Martin was an eminent consultant psychiatrist in Darlington, County Durham, who, in his will, bequeathed a substantial amount of money to enable an annual brass band competition to take place which was named after Dr Martin's home - "Wainstones". The inaugural competition took place last year.

This year, a strong field of 10 bands took part in including 3 who qualified for the National Finals at the Albert Hall. The

competition format is slightly different to traditional contests in that instead of a playing a single test piece or entertainment programme, each band is required to play a march, a solo and a test piece. Friary chose to play the march 'Mephistopheles', 'A Troika, Tidy!' from Karl Jenkins' Euphonium Concerto and Wilfred Heaton's 'Contest Music'. The Band performed very well, in particular Chris Straker who wowed the audience with some superb playing in his solo.

Adjudicator Kevin Wadsworth, commented 'Superb show' and 'Great ensemble'. He awarded a total of 191/200 across the three pieces which gave the Band an overall placing of  $3^{rd}$  and a prize pot of £1000. Chris was just pipped to the soloist prize by the principal cornet of winning band Reg Vardy, Tina Mortimer.

### Contests coming up



As normal, there is a full schedule of competitions in Friary's calendar and they have recently found out what pieces are in store for them in the set test piece competitions. At the Area contest in March, the band will be performing the notoriously technical piece 'Devil & the Deep Blue Sea' by Derek Bourgeois. Shortly after, at the Spring Festival in Blackpool, the Band will be tackling Martin Ellerby's take on Elgar's Enigma Variations in 'Elgar Variations'. This was selected as the set test piece for the English Nationals this year so will surely present a stern challenge!



The long running SCABA autumn contest has been held at Leas Cliff Hall in Folkestone for the last 27 years. Sadly, this would be the last at the venue as SCABA seek another location due to various factors affecting the Leas venue. Next year, the contest will move to the current location of the SCABA entertainment competition, The Hawth in Crawley.

Friary were looking to win back the title after missing out last year. MD Chris King, selected a challenging test piece to play in order to stretch the Band and show their intent on winning back the trophy. 'Rococo Variations' by Edward Gregson was used as the British Open test piece just 3 years ago and provided a demanding test, particularly as rehearsals only started after the Wainstone's Cup. Adjudicator, Kevin Wadsworth, who placed the Band 3<sup>rd</sup>

in Middlesbrough clearly enjoyed Friary's performance again and awarded them first place with Euphonium Chris Straker winning best Euphonium. Friary also won the best Bass section trophy and Chris King won the best Conductor award. The Band were thrilled to win back the huge trophy to put back in the cabinet!

Principal cornet player, Richard Straker added: "The British Champions Day was the most valuable raceday ever run in the UK with £3 million on offer and the race named in Her Majesty's honour, 'The Queen Elizabeth II Stakes', was the highest value mile race ever run in the country at £1m. We didn't win that one, but I'd like to think we were the winners in the musical stakes!"
